**Subject:** Steps to guard against registration of vehicles at fictitious address on the strength of forged documents/false information.

Reference on the subject cited above.

Govt. of India, New Delhi has directed to impress upon the RTAs/RAAs for registration of vehicles with the following aspects:-

- (i) The documents need to be carefully scrutinized and verified by the concerned officials. The RTAs/RAAs need to be made personally responsible for ensuring verification of documents.
- (ii) Action to cancel registration of the vehicle should be taken under Section 55 (5) of Motor Vehicle Act wherever any case of registration of a vehicle on the strength of false information or documents is detected. Besides, in case the acts disclose any criminal offence, the matter must be reported to police authorities.
- (iii) A random check be conducted periodically to verify genuineness of the address, as also whether the change of address has been got recorded by vehicle owner, if applicable, as per provisions of rule 59 of Central Motor Vehicle Rules, 1989.

Besides above two-three identity proofs should be taken from perspective vehicle owners as already directed and if any case of fraudulent registration of a vehicle discloses negligence or complicity on the part of any official, appropriate action under the relevant service rules may be taken against him to secure safety and security of the general public.
