Minutes of the meeting of State Road Safety Council held on 24.05.2017 at 11:00 AM under the Chairmanship of Sh. Krishan Lal Panwar, Hon'ble Transport Minister, Haryana.

A meeting of the State Road Safety Council was held on 24.05.2017 at 11.00 AM at New Civil Secretariat, Sector-17, Chandigarh under the Chairmanship of Sh. Krishan Lal Panwar, Hon'ble Transport Minister, Haryana. The list of participants is enclosed as Annexure-A.

At the outset, Dr. Suprabha Dahiya, IAS, Transport Commissioner welcomed the Hon'ble Transport Minister, Haryana and the participants. Addressing the participants, she stated that a total of 11234 accidents occurred during the year 2016 and 5024 people died and 10531 were injured. There has been an increase in the number of deaths on road accidents as compared to the previous years. Therefore, more sincere efforts and more effective road safety measures are required to be undertaken to reduce the number of road accidents. All the departments need to put in more concerted efforts in order to make a visible impact.

ACS(T) asked the Chief Engineer, Urban Local Bodies Department to intimate as to how much time is required for the rectification of accident prone points. Chief Engineer, ULB Department could not give the tentative date for rectification of the same in the meeting. The Chief Engineer, ULB could not inform as to why the Principal Secretary. or Director, ULB were not present in the meeting. Upon this the Transport Minister expressed his displeasure and desired that the HOD shall himself come for the meeting of the State Road Safety Council meeting in future. ACS(T) also directed the concerned departments to make all out efforts to rectify the remaining 111 points within the next one month i.e. by 21.01.2017. It was decided that the PWD(B&R), NHAI & HSIDC will also complete work on their pending points within the next one month i.e. by 21.01.2017 and submit report to the Transport Department.

EIC, PWD (B&R) informed that as per the latest report they have rectified all the points pertaining to PWD for the period 2007-10 and period 2012-14 and that the rest 58 points of 2007-10 and 47 points of 2012-14 relate to NHAI. The representative NHAI of Chandigarh informed that in the list of accident prone points to be rectified by NHAI 58 points relate to the year 2007-10, and 47 points to the year 2012-2014. He informed that the list of all these points has been circulated to all the PIUs. These accidents prone points will be rectified as per the provisions of IRC & prevailing site conditions. ACS (T) stated that this is a very general statement and it is not clear whether actual rectification has actually taken place. On the other hand EIC PWD (B&R) again reiterated that all the balance points are to be rectified by NHAI and not by PWD (B&R). ACS(T) expressed his concern that in the last meeting held on 21.12.2016, directions were issued to PWD (B&R) to hold a joint meeting with NHAI to resolve the issue as to which agency NHAI or PWD(B&R) will undertake

 ACS(T) further directed the Police department to submit a fresh survey report of identified new Accident Prone Points at the earliest. Bowever the same position exists today also. ACS(T) desired that ACS(PWD) should bold a meeting and resolve this issue of points to be rectified between PWR(D(R&R) & WNAL PWD(B&R) is the Notal Department for both PWD & NHAL ACS (PWD) informed that be will hold a meeting with all the concerned departments within a week and submit complete status of pending issues. 3.	Installation of Road signage, Markings, Cat eyes etc. NHAI informed that numerous road signages/road marking and cat's eyes have been fixed by them on NH-1 and it is a continuous process. The report of fresh survey in urban and rural areas as decided in the meeting has not been received from any department. ACS(T) directed the police department to conduct joint survey with PWD, HUDA, ULB & HSAMB and submit the report within next one month i.e. by 21.01.2017.	PWD (B&R), HUDA, ULB, HSAMB, NHAI & Police	The representative of NHAI informed that road signage, markings & cat eyes have been installed at several places. Installation of road signage, marking and provision of cat eyes is a continuous process and executed need based. ACS [PWD(B&R)] stated that the provision of road markings and signage's as per the IRC standard has been made in the estimates for the works approved in the work permits for the period 2015-16 and 2016-17. ACS (T) and ACS [PWD (B&R)] stated that the signage are not sufficient and proper on all National Highways. AIG (T&H) informed that generally on Entry or Exit points diversion signage does not exist but wherever they have been erected they serve no purpose as their location is very illogical. In fact these boards result in confusing the drivers. ACS(T) informed that when the vehicle is moving at a speed of 90 Kmph on the National Highway, the signage should be erected at a distance of 500 mtrs before the exit, then at 100 mtrs and then 50 mtrs. But the present status of signage is very poor and the road users can not reach their destination on the basis of the existing signage. He directed that NHAI should engage some

			expert/consultant like DIMTS to identify the location of signage in a scientific manner. ACS (ULB) informed that the auditing of the same is being done through DIMTS in district Gurgaon. Police department informed that a survey has been conducted during the year 2016. As per the survey locations have been identified where corrective measures are required to be undertaken. This includes the locations of 350 Sign Boards, 199 cat eyes, 15 traffic lights, 5 Zebra Crossings and 3 Reflectors. The detailed survey is being forwarded to the
			the detailed survey is being forwarded to the concerned departments for rectification. All the concerned departments were directed that the work on the same be got done within 4 months i.e. by 24.09.2017 positively.
4.	Construction of Foot over bridges and under bridges. NHAI informed that the work on foot over bridges has been completed on 57 locations on Highways and on seven locations it is in progress on Hisar National Highway in Hisar Unit. DIG Traffic informed that some foot-over bridges are hanging due to non construction of steps on the ground and hence they are not being used by the public. NHAI informed that work is going on at 20 locations in the State and they will complete the work within one month. It was pointed out in the meeting that information regarding construction of foot-over bridge on NH-71 A at Village Israna, District Panipat has not been received. Similarly, the proposal to bring down traffic jams in Panipat city by	NHAI & PWD(B& R)	 NHAI Chandigarh informed that – (a) Construction of 16 FOBs is going on. (b) Due to non availability of land, the foot over bridge at village Israna cannot be constructed. (c) Panipat Flyover:- Regarding widening of road under Panipat flyover PD, NHAI stated that it is not feasible. However, permission has been given to PWD (B&R) for laying of interlocking tiles. (d) Unauthorized cuts:- The work from Mukarba chowk to Panipat shall now be looked after by PIU EPE, RO EPE. On Mukarba- Panipat stretch, the work of widening of road is being done with inadequate road safety measures and wiremesh has also disappeared at Gharaunda. It seems that no road safety audit has been undertaken. The Paonta Sahib road in yamunanagar is being widened but no road

			safety measures have been taken Sh. Sushil Arya, Non-official member informed that on NH-73 no signage/boards have been installed. He was requested to submit photos to the Transport Department so that the same could be sent through DO letter to Hon'ble Minister Sh. Nitin Gadkari or Chairman NHAI. It was directed that Sh. SK Gupta, GM, NHAI, Sh. Sushil Arya NGO , Publicity Officer (Road Safety)o/o Transport Commissioner and Sh. Gurmeet Singh representative of Police department will conduct inspection of NH-1 on road safety measures within a week positively.
6.	Provision of Trauma Care facilities in all important hospitals along the Highways. It was intimated by Director, O/o DGHS that the DGHS has provided the list of all Govt. Hospitals, Private Hospitals on National Highways, along with names of Nodal officers and their contact numbers. Transport Commissioner directed the health department to indicate the exact locations of all Hospitals along with contact numbers and name of nodal officers and send it to the Transport Department & DIG, Traffic so that it can be displayed on National Highways/State Highways/Major District Roads including Toll Plazas, Police Control Rooms and websites of Transport, Health, NHAI and Police Department. NHAI has also sent the list of locations of Ambulances and their contact numbers, which will be circulated by Transport Department. ACS(T) directed that it may also be ensured that ambulances with Paramedical Staff on National Highways are deployed for carrying road accident victims to the nearest trauma care centers.	Health, Police, NHAI & Transport	Health Department has provided the list of all Govt. Hospitals, Private Hospitals on National Highways, along with names of Nodal officers and their contact numbers to NHAI and Police department. ACS(T) directed that the same be uploaded on the website of the Transport deptt. During discussions it emerged that doctors are not available in govt. hospitals during the night. Sh. Sushil Arya informed that in G.H Yamunanagar and Karnal doctors are not willing to treat the road accident victims. ACS (T) asked to provide details of a particular case, so that the matter could be got enquired into. AIG also observed that the drivers of Govt. hospital ambulances could be in collusion with Private hospitals for their self interest and they take the victims to the private hospitals. Health department informed that they will track through Civil Surgeons and if any irregularities are found, action will be taken. Sh. Sushil Arya informed that in district Yamunanagar, signed referral lists are available. ACS(T) directed that we should write to the health department that Para Medical staff may be provided on all 43 Ambulances of Police department as per past practice. At least two persons be provided in each district. Transport Commissioner asked health

			department that list of Life Support Ambulance Services be provided to Transport department, so that the tax rebate is provided only to those vehicles which fulfill the condition of being registered as an ambulance.
7.	Removal of liquor shops and Ahatas from Highways. It was intimated by representative of Excise & Taxation department that all the liquor shops on National/State Highways have been removed and there is no violation at present. The SLP (C) No. 8971 of 2014 filed by the State in the Hon'ble Supreme Court has been decided on 15.12.2016. This order will be applicable from 1 st April, 2017 upon fresh allotment of liquor shops and Ahatas. Transport Commissioner directed the representative of Excise department to send the judgment of the Hon'ble Court immediately as the information is required to be furnished to the Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety. 1.	The Committee expressed its disappointment that the total number of fatalities in the State have gone up from 4879 in 2015 to 5024 in 2016 is. an increase of 145 fatalities. The number of accidents has also gone up. The Committee directed the State to analyze the causes for increase in number of accidents and fatalities and take specific measures to bring about 10% decrease in 2017.	Transport Commissioner informed that the observations of the Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety dated 25.04.2017 have been sent to all concerned departments vide memo no. 30131- 41/AT-8/RSB dated 15.05.2016 for taking necessary action at the earliest and to submit report to the Transport Department. ACS(T) directed all the concerned departments to take action at the earliest and to send action taken report to the Transport Commissioner office within a week positively.
2.	The Committee was also disappointed to note that the fatalities in the first quarter of 2017 have increased by 3.17 % over the corresponding period of 2016 which shows that no effective measures have been adopted by the state officials to curb the increase in number of road fatalities. The Committee stated that the data on accidents and fatalities should be sent on a quarterly basis and the Committee would review this data every quarter.	
3.	The quarterly report submitted clearly showed that the Committee directions dated 18.08.2015 and 17.11.2015 relating to certain offences including drunken driving, over speeding, red light jumping and Helmet/seat belt are not being enforced in the State. The Committee directed the State to strictly enforce them and send regular report to the Committee.	
4.	The State Government was directed to ensure that the Council meets at least twice a year and to regularly send minutes of the meeting and the Action Taken Report thereon to the Committee.	
5.	The Committee noted that the Lead Agencies headed by the Transport Commissioner. The Committee directed that as per the Committee's letter number 16/2016/CoRS dated 24 th November, 2016, the Lead Agency should be headed by a senior officer on full time basis with adequate dedicated staff. The Lead Agency should be made set up accordingly and made

The Committee reminded the state representatives to provide, in its Road Safety Action Plan, year wise targets for reduction of fatalities and road accidents, the resources required achieving the targets, the nodal agencies for each activity mentioned, and the strategy the State proposes to adopt to achieve those targets.	
9.	Further progress in digitization of driving license and registration data should be reported to the Committee. Access to the data should also be granted to the Insurance Companies.	
10.	The Committee was informed that the state has a Surakshit School Vahan Policy which monitors the status and condition of the school buses plying in the state and takes necessary action accordingly to ensure road safety.	
11.	The Committee directed that all liquor shops situated within 500m. of National and State Highways should be removed in accordance with the recent judgment by Hon'ble Supreme Court.	
12.	The Committee directed that its direction dated 3rd August. 2016 regarding road safety audit in respect of projects costing more that Rs.10.00 cr. should be strictly implemented by the concerned authorities, The state should also ensure that road safety furniture is provided at all the construction sites within the State.	
13.	The Committee directed the State to periodically check whether the vehicle owners have 3 rd party insurance cover in case of failure of which the vehicle should be detained till the valid Insurance Certificate is produced by the owner.	
14.	The Committee observed that the number of 'hit and run' cases in the State is quite high and said that the State Govt. should set up Solatium Fund to compensate the victims.	

ACS(T) observed that there can be at least 25% reduction in road accidents if NHAI and PWD(B&R) and other road engineering departments install speed breakers/rumble strips and proper signage on all the National Highways and State Highways and main district roads, close unauthorized/illegal cuts and conduct road safety audit from time to time and monitor road activities regularly.

Hon'ble Transport Minister observed that during the winter season when there is very dense fog a large number of accidents are recorded. It is desirable that road marking on every road by every engineering department i.e. NHAI, PWD, ULB, HUDA and HSAMB is undertaken before the start of the season. This will be very useful for road users and help in reducing the road accidents. He also mentioned that whenever any tree falls on the road, the forest department, PWD(B&R) and NHAI take a long time to remove the trees, which is also a major cause of road accidents. Forest department be issued directions to remove these trees as well as dead trees from the roadside at the earliest. Police Patrolling on highways should be more effective. Illegal cuts be got closed immediately and good quality signage be installed by all the road owning/managing agencies.

Effective enforcement should be done by the Transport and Police Department to check various offences under Motor Vehicle Act and challans and suspension of driving licences should be done in compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court Committee. Informatory sign boards should be erected at prominent places and the compliance report be submitted within one month positively. The Hon'ble Transport Minister expressed his displeasure over non-participation of the members in the meeting. He desired that this lapse be brought to the notice of the Chief Secretary. He also directed that in future members of the State Road Safety Council will attend the meeting in person and not through their representatives. No non-member will be allowed to participate in the meeting in future.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
