# Points for discussion with CS, Haryana

1. Strategy for reducing road accidents in the State (PI see annexure)

## 2. State Road Safety Council:

State Road Safety Council did not meet regularly. State should ensure that the Council meets at least twice a year and that action taken reports on the decisions taken by the Council in the meetings are placed before the Council in its next meeting.

#### 3 Lead Agency:

Status: Lead Agency notified on 08.09.2016 is a 'Secretariat' working from the office of the Transport Commissioner under the charge of Secretary, Transport/Transport Commissioner/Transport Department and comprising of 11 officers/personnel to be posted from different Departments. Functions of the Lead agency were notified on 09.03.2017.

Issues:

- Lead Agency is not headed by a full time senior officer.
- Full time staff having domain knowledge does not appear to have been provided.

## Road Safety Fund:

Road Safety Fund Rules have been notified on 29th June, 2018. These Rules do not establish a non-lapsable Road Safety Fund.

[These Rules essentially provide for making budget provision for road safety and lay down procedure of incurring expenditure out of the budget provision in the normal course

# 5. District Road Safety Committees:

District Road Safety Committees did not meet regularly.

Each District Road Safety Committee should conduct district wise analysis of accident & fatality data; identify all vulnerable road segments in the district; and adopt specific strategies for reducing road accidents and fatalities.

### Police Department

- (i) Inadequacy of Police Strength for Traffic Enforcement
- (ii) Inadequacy and non-maintenance of Enforcement Equipment(Speed guns, Interceptors, Alcohol meters)
- (iii) Strengthen Enforcement for:
  - (a) Helmet Violation both by Drivers and Pillion riders
  - (b) Over-speeding
  - (c) Over-loading

- (d) Vehicle worthiness Basic Checks/ Visual Checks at toll Gates by toll operators and report the vehicle registration number to police/ Transport Department
- (iv) Setting up of special patrol forces along National and State Highways
- 7. Cities: Urban Road Safety Audits to be taken up for immediate solution
- 8. Issue Standard Instructions for Speed Control and Pedestrian Safety e.g.: Traffic Calming Measures (TCM) to start with:
  - (i) Immediate Solutions
  - (ii) All Major Roads -Minor Roads joining junctions on NH, SH, MDRs in a phased manner in next 3 years
  - (iii) Village Gates to be installed
  - (iv) Table-tops Pedestrian crossings to be made at vulnerable locations
  - Implementation of Orders of Bombay High Court dated 12th April, 2018 on 9 potholes
- 10. Emergency Care:
  - (i) Advertise& display Good Samaritan guidelines
  - (ii) Directions given by Hon'ble Supreme Court in Pt. Parmanand Katara Vs. UOI should be implemented.
  - (iii) Establish at least one Trauma Care Centre in each district.
- 11. DIMTS Audit Report: State should take action on (i) roads/locations specified in the Audit Report immediately and (ii) all over the State in a phased manner.
