**Minutes of meeting regarding presentation of Capacity and Capability Building for Strengthening Data-Driven Road Safety Initiatives in Haryana Project Report of Centre of Excellence for Road Safety IIT Madras on 03.04.2025 under the Chairmanship of Worthy Chief Secretary, Haryana.**

A Meeting on the above mentioned subject was held on 03.04.2025.

At the outset, Sh. Ashok Khemka, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Transport welcomed the Chief Secretary, Haryana and representatives of stakeholder departments. He pointed out that the State Government is committed to taking effective steps to reduce the number of accidents by working on the four E's: Enforcement, Engineering (Roads and Vehicles), Education and Emergency Care. It was also pointed out that the State of Haryana is on neither lowest nor highest position in case of accidents and fatalities in the Country. The presentation was placed before Chief Secretary on the work done by Centre of Excellence for Road Safety (CoERS), IIT Madras and following decisions were taken:

**Presentation:**

1. Prof. Venkatesh Balasubramanian, Head, Centre of Excellence for Road Safety (CoERS), IIT Madras gave a presentation on Data-Driven Intervention in Road Safety in Haryana. He presented work done by them in the last two years as part of the previous MoU. The discussion emphasized the importance of implementing CoERS' 5 Es framework encompassing Engineering, Enforcement, Emergency Care, Education put together by Empathy (Human Factors) and

utilizing Data Driven Interventions approach for strengthening road safety in Haryana.

**2. Trauma Centres in the State.**

The matter regarding preparedness of trauma centres in the State was discussed in detail. The ACS (Health) pointed out that there is an acute shortage of quality trauma centres in the State. Further, he stated that the trauma centres established in the State have different quality level. Prof. Venkatesh Balasubramanian apprised that they can examine the hospitals qualities and can submit his report regarding current status of trauma cares and suggest improvement required in quality of trauma cares and hospitals. ACS(T) suggested that a separate meeting may be called under the Chairmanship of W/CS after examining the study reports submitted by IIT Madras on preparedness of trauma centres in other States. Accordingly, IIT Madras is to submit study reports for the same at the earliest.

Further, ACS (Health) suggested to form a health department committee to study and deploy trauma care initiatives taken by CoERS, IIT Madras for Trauma care baseline survey, Super-hotspots analytics, Golden hour management practices and Static and dynamic ambulance positioning.

**3. Road Safety Road Map:**

The Chairman desired that CoERS, IIT Madras to share a road safety roadmap and budget estimate for creating road safety strategies and its implementation. Further, a working group with nodal officers from all the stakeholder departments be framed with whom CoERS, IIT Madras can work and deploy its road safety strategies.

**4. Integration of ambulances with dial 112:**

ADGP, Traffic apprised that the ambulances available in the trauma cares have been connected with dial 112 for accident assistance and to take victims to the concerned trauma care centres. He also stated that they are in the progress to connect private trauma cares/hospitals ambulances to connect them with dial 112. The Chairman directed ADGP, Traffic to identify and submit the list of

private trauma care centres not empanelled with State Government/Ayushman Bharat and supply the list to DGHS and ACS(Health) to take further necessary action in this matter to save the life of road accident victims during golden hours.

**5. Mitigation of accidents and fatalities:**

The Chairman expressed concern about the accidents and deaths happening in the State. ACS (Transport) submitted that the MoU has been assigned to develop strategies for integrating all stakeholder departments, developing a road map towards reducing road fatalities and IIT Madras to provide all support required to implement suggested changes in a timely manner. IIT Madras shall implement a structured follow up mechanism for monitoring process of road safety initiatives across all participant departments. IIT Madras will conduct the required audit or any work what will be required by the department. An interdepartmental team shall be constituted including appointment of Nodal Officer of each department who will coordinate in all activities. The number of death in an accident can only be mitigated by reducing the time to take the accident victim to nearest trauma centre.

Prof. Venkatesh Balasubramanian, IIT Madras appraised the house that the Lead Agency or stakeholder departments are invited to visit the Tamil Nadu State to study best practices adopted on road safety.

At last, an MoU has been signed between Sh. Dusmanta Kumar Behera, IAS, Transport Commissioner, Haryana and Professor Venkatesh Balasubramanian, IIT Madras in the presence of Worthy Chief Secretary, Haryana for a period of two years to develop strategies for Road Safety and Support State in developing a road map towards reducing road fatalities from road traffic accidents.
